

## First Week of School



## Thursday, September 10th

- Upon arrival, students will check in at tables outside on the black top area. There will be signs (in alphabetic order) by student's last name.
- We will give students a label to identify their classroom teacher.
   This label will be stickered to their shirt to identify which class they will be assigned to. Once the bell rings, we will have the students line up by the cones labelled with their teacher's name.
- Classes will be brought in once the bell rings and students will settle in with their teacher for the morning. Staff will circulate to assist students in this process.
- Student numbers are not confirmed at this time, so your child will be assigned to a teacher until Friday. There may be some minor changes based on registrations, then class lists will be finalized as soon as possible.
- Due to the nature of our safety and cohort planning during Stage 2, new requests for class placement cannot be accommodated at this time.
- Careful consideration is given to placing all students in the best learning environment possible.

Dismissal on the first day will be at 10:40 a.m. Supervision will be provided after school until 10:55 am. Please make sure that you use the **Student Daily Health Check** every day to ensure your child/children are healthy. This form is provided at the end of this newsletter.

- Please remember to pack a lunch, a water bottle and inside shoes. Please label all personal items.

## Bell Schedule 2020-2021

In order to allow for minimal traffic flow in the hallways and reduced number of students on the playground, we have created two schedules. These include staggered recess and lunch times, while keeping consistent start and dismissal times (for ease of family pick up and drop-off). Each group will include both primary and intermediate students and staff within 2-3 cohorts. You will be notified of your child's cohort and group on the first day of school.

Learning Groups/Cohorts: As per the Ministry of Education Restart Plan, our school will be working within learning groups or cohorts of up to 60 students and staff. A learning group is a group of students and staff who remain together throughout the school year and who primarily interact with each other. Each cohort or learning group will be made up of 2 or 3 classes. These classes will be able to join together within the cohort for projects and activities. Learning groups/cohorts provide a range of benefits for students including more in-class learning time, increased peer interaction and support, and decreased feelings of isolation. Teachers and administrators who normally do not work strictly in a learning group/cohort will be required to wear a mask if they cannot physically distance.

<u>Masks</u> are not required for elementary students within their classes and learning groups. Students who wish to wear masks, will of course be able to do so. The district will provide our school with directional arrows and signage to ensure that the students can follow directions and traffic flow.

<u>Safety Procedures:</u> The School District Health and Safety Department have been working tirelessly this summer to ensure that all protocols and safety procedures are in place to keep students and staff safe. Please read the information in the above links where health and safety measures are carefully outlined.
